#### 1. From the President

A thought about the technology used to screen our films. Over the last 12 months there has been a noticeable increase in the number of companies offering film rental by "streaming" over the internet. This includes SBS, JBHiFi, EZYDVD, Antidote films, Telstra and many more. Is it reaching a point where ACOFS needs to consider making downloads or streaming of selected titles available to member societies? Is this the next big leap forward? More to the point, How does this fit in with our aims? ACOFS plans to research this question, but first I leave it with you to ponder.

## 2. FVFS Indie Films Library

At the recent ACOFS AGM, it was agreed to endorse the work being done by the FVFS (Federation of Victorian Film Societies) in bringing Indie films to film societies. The FVFS is now supported by ACOFS as being a source of Indie films for all member societies across Australia. All prices relate to screenings to members only (ie non-theatrically).

The initial Indie films in their library are:

- 1. PEARLS OF THE FAR EAST. Free loan and rights through the FVFS for \$55. Further information is in past ACOFS Bulletins.
- 2. FOUR OF A KIND. Australia 2009, 115min, Drama, M. Free loan from the FVFS or purchase from Antidote for \$15. Then pay the FVFS \$35 for screening rights. Or purchase the DVD with included rights from Antidote for \$49.95.
- 3. A DAY IN A LIFE. Canada, 2000, 94 mins, No rating. Borrow for free from the FVFS library and pay the FVFS \$35 for screening rights. Or purchase a copy on line, including screening rights for \$79.95.
- 4. McLEAN'S MONEY. Australia, 2013, 97 min, Comedy/Drama. Free loan from the FVFS or purchase from the director for \$15. Pay the FVFS \$35 for screening rights.
- CRUSHED. Australia, 2008, 90 Min, PG, Drama. Free loan from the FVFS, and pay the FVFS \$20 for screening rights. Or purchase from the director for \$25 (including screening rights).

## 3. ACOFS AGM Report

The 2014 ACOFS AGM was held in Sydney on 23<sup>rd</sup> and 24<sup>th</sup> May. It was attended by 20 delegates from all States and our guest speaker was Jane Cruickshank from the NFSA. Here are some key actions or decisions coming from the meeting.

- 1. The ACOFS Executive voted in at the AGM are as follows:
  - a. President: Ian Davidson (Vic)
  - b. V. President: Leth Maitland (NSW)
  - c. Secretary: Prodos Marinakis (Vic)
  - d. Treasurer: John Turner (Vic)
  - e. Committee: Kerry McKinnon (Qld)
  - f. Committee: Mark Horner (Tas)
  - g. Committee: David Smith (WA)
- 2. ACOFS is to evaluate the offer of additional Indie films from Indonesia/Malaysia with a view to making them available to members.
- 3. ACOFS needs to promote to members the free 16mm collection held by Paul Bywater (Tas)
- 4. An ACOFS sub-group is to prepare a report on film "streaming" and its relevance to film societies.
- 5. ACOFS will further examine the value of film insurance to 35mm and DCP film societies, to help refine the ACOFS insurance policy.
- Film societies can expect to be invited by the NFSA to participate in a survey of film society needs as part of their move to define a new "business model" for access to the NFSA collections.
- 7. NSW Federation now has a website which is very basic to date but is soon to be expanded. See <a href="https://www.filmsocietiesnsw.org.au">www.filmsocietiesnsw.org.au</a>.
- 8. A website is about to be launched for the WA Federation.
- 9. The number of member organisations in all Federations is increasing. As at May 2014 there were:
  - a. Victoria 79 (Of which 10 are in SA)
  - b. NSW 12
  - c. Qld 13
  - d. Tas 17
  - e. WA 9

- 10. ACOFS handling of the Madman DVD screening rights is still working well with bookings from members in all states. The most popular films for 2013 were "Searching for Sugar Man" and "Kid with a Bike".
- 11. Madman does not hold non-theatrical screening rights for all titles on their website. Some titles might only have commercial rights while other titles are being sold by Madman on behalf of other smaller distributors. So always check apparent Madman titles with <a href="mailto:dvdrights@acofs.org.au">dvdrights@acofs.org.au</a> and give plenty of notice!
- 12. It is noted that some film societies book their films only a few weeks ahead. It is recommended that a society organise their bookings for the whole year at a time for several reasons. 1/ You only need to do it once per year. 2/ You end up with an annual program and can produce an attractive brochure for publicity. 3/ A 12 month's program is much easier to "sell" when the members can see what they are getting, and 4/ You need only one major promotion effort each year. The argument that a 12 month program might miss out on the "latest" titles is countered by the fact that many distributors often don't release DVDs straight away anyway!
- 13. We have had very little feedback from film societies wanting access to the ACMI 16mm lending collection. ACOFS is therefore not in a strong position to argue that access is still a high priority for film societies. This collection of 160,000 items is now being evaluated and its future is still uncertain. The status of the French and Chinese Embassy collections is also unclear at this time.
- 14. ACOFS endorses the FVFS action to operate a library of Indie films on DVD and agrees that it should be available to member film societies in all States. See separate item in this Bulletin.
- 15. The need to have society accounts audited no longer applies because "Auditing" has taken on a new stricter meaning under Consumer Affairs rules. Auditing can now only be conducted by a practicing, qualified auditing accountant, taking it out of reach of most volunteer organisations. However, the rules now provide for the annual financial report of a film society to be "verified" by another member of the society and "endorsed" by the committee.
- 16. The next ACOFS AGM is to be in Melbourne in April or May 2015.

#### 4. News from the SLC at the NFSA

At the ACOFS AGM on 24<sup>th</sup> May 2014 our guest from the NFSA (National Film and Sound Archives), Jane Cruickshank (a/g General Manager, Access, Outreach and Communications) provided a brief overview of what is happening to the Screen Lending Collection. (previously known as the NTLC – the Non-Theatrical Lending Collection).

The Lending Collection was transferred from ACMI some 10 years ago together with its own catalogue, booking and invoicing system. This system is now obsolete and incompatible with the new NFSA system. Also, the NFSA will increasingly concentrate on digital technology to preserve, collect and share the collection in an environment of funding, storage, copyright and other challenges.

It is proposed that all NFSA collections be combined and listed in the one catalogue, booking and invoicing system. All titles will thus be searchable and bookable in the one system which will also indicate whether the title comes with screening rights included or not.

All titles that have screening rights will still be available and the fees will include those rights. Rights for many of the titles in the Screen Lending Collection have been granted for the lifetime of the print or DVD, but some are about to expire in the next few years. Titles without rights should also be available for booking but the borrower will need to obtain the screening rights before screening it publicly. How this will be done is yet to be determined. There is no guarantee that the rights can be or will be renewed.

The status of the German Goethe Institute films is unclear at this stage.

There is likely to be a small price rise in about June 2014 (to match CPI), but pricing beyond July 2015 is still to be determined. NFSA are keen to cover their costs and overheads in an environment where existing funds have to go further every year.

The NFSA will in future be focussing on the preservation and availability of Australian titles as this better aligns with their stated objectives to preserve, collect and share Australia's audio – visual heritage. Future acquisitions are not likely to include any foreign films

The "new model" for the Screen Lending Collection is still under development and many aspects need to be worked out. NFSA will be seeking input and comments from borrowers and intend to set up an on-line survey to gather this information. NFSA will be contacting current users directly, and ACOFS will ensure all members are kept informed.

#### Summary.

- 1. The cost of borrowing from the Screen Lending Collection is likely to increase by the CPI in about July 2014.
- 2. It is unlikely that any new international titles will be added to the collection.
- 3. The borrowing fee past July 2015 is yet to be determined but may vary according to whether a title has rights included.
- After July 2015 borrowers may need to negotiate rights separately from arranging to borrow the film or DVD. This will be the case more and more often as rights expire.
- 5. Any bookings made prior to June 2015 will be honoured.
- 6. ACOFS and member film societies will continue to be consulted as plans become clearer.

## 7. The ACOFS Rights Agreement

The DVD rights agreement Fact Sheet 3B is constantly being updated as new distributors come to our notice or existing ones change their contact details. Download one today to keep up to date. <a href="www.acofs.org.au/resources/">www.acofs.org.au/resources/</a>. The latest version was uploaded on 1<sup>st</sup> June 2014.

Note that this agreement applies to non-theatrical screenings (ie to members only) where the film society provides the DVD. It does not apply to DVDs rented from "Video shops" as they have home screening licences only.

The ACOFS agreement does not apply to 16mm, 35mm or 2K digital screenings.

#### 8. News From the DVD Distributors

These DVD distributors are party to the ACOFS DVD rights agreement, under which member film societies pay special affordable prices for their DVD screening rights. As ACOFS' part of the agreement, we promote the distributor's catalogues and especially information on any new acquisitions.





#### 9. New DVDs from the SLC at the NFSA


The SLC (Screen Lending Collection) is part of the NFSA (National Film and Sound Archive) in Canberra. There are over 1,024 DVD and BluRay feature films available for loan to film societies at \$16.50 (as at Feb 2014 - including rights and delivery to you). See their catalogue at <a href="loans.nfsa.gov.au">loans.nfsa.gov.au</a>

These DVD (or Blu-ray if marked BR) titles have been added to the SLC in the last 90 days and are licensed for screening by film societies.
