1. From the President, Ian Davidson – NFSA Announcement Pending?

On 8th April 2015, Michael Loebenstein (CEO NFSA) announced the release of the much anticipated NFSA Strategic Plan for 2015-2018. It is now available for anyone to download and read from

http://www.nfsa.gov.au/plan/ In his words, "It is a roadmap and clearly articulates what our focus and priorities will be for the next three years".

But don't get too enthusiastic just yet because it is a top level plan and does not get into specifics of what will happen to the NTLC collections!

You will have to come to the ACOFS AGM for that! Representatives from the NFSA will attend the forthcoming ACOFS AGM in Nunawading (Vic) and hopefully will provide more details as to the future of these important NTLC collections.

- Will the 16mm collection continue to be available to film societies?
- Will the existing DVD collection continue to be available to film societies and will it grow?
- Will the rights for existing DVDs in the collection be renewed when they expire?
- Will there be a change in direction for the NTLC acquisitions?
- Will there be any changes to the charges for using the collections?
- Will there be any changes to the booking mechanisms?

ACOFS has been asking these questions of the NFSA for some time, following their announcements that the services may be curtailed, so we are waiting anxiously for some more details.

As the Strategic Plan is now released, we are hoping that their agreement to send someone to the ACOFS AGM means there are some announcements pending. We can but hope!

- and... will Streaming Impact Film Societies?

On another issue, I imagine you will all have heard of the new internet video download streaming services (VOD or Video on Demand) such as Stan and Netflix that allow subscribers to catch up on missed TV episodes and documentaries as well as new release movies, but what will the impact be on film societies?

Recent press articles have focussed on the expected impact on broadcast and cable TV but, not surprisingly, they have not mentioned the impact on cinema and film societies.

It is anticipated that the streaming and subscriber services that provide "view-on-demand" services will have a great impact on TV watching. Imagine how attractive it will be to watch what you want, when you want to, rather than when it is broadcast. While the PVR allows the time-shifting of broadcast TV, the general feeling is that streamed TV over the internet will be far more popular.

But what about the impact on film societies?

When DVDs first hit the marketplace the pessimists said the ability to watch your movies in good quality at home would be the finish of film societies, but in reality it gave them a new lease on life. It became easier to obtain sought-after titles and once rights were cleared, it became easier to screen to members. Because a film society is a social gathering of members and much more than just watching a movie, film societies prospered. There are now more film societies operating in Australia than at any time in the history of the film society movement.

And so I believe it will be with the new streaming services. Anyone who wants to watch at home on their TV or even their big screen will benefit from streaming, but for the film societies it is just another way to obtain the movie legally, prior to seeking the screening rights, and should make little or no difference to the programming style, the ambience or the popularity of film societies.

So look forward to even more film societies starting up in the coming years.

3. The ACOFS DVD Rights Agreement

The DVD rights agreement Fact Sheet 3B is constantly being updated as new distributors come to our notice or existing ones change their contact details. Download one today to keep up to date. www.acofs.org.au/resources/. There have been some changes to the contacts. The latest version was uploaded on 21st Feb 2015.

The ACOFS agreement applies only to fully paid up societies that screen DVDs non-theatrically (ie to members only) and only where the society sources their own copy of the DVD. The agreement does not cover supply of the DVD from the distributor, although the society may make their own arrangements in this regard. So ARE YOU FULLY PAID UP FOR 2015?

The ACOFS agreement does not apply to 16mm, 35mm or 2K digital screenings.


4. News From the DVD Distributors


