HOW TO ACCESS THE FRENCH, CHINESE & RUSSIAN EMBASSY COLLECTIONS HELD AT ACMI in Melbourne.

In July 2004, when management of the National Film and Video Lending Service was taken over by the National Film & Sound Archive in Canberra, the Australian Centre for the Moving Image gave an assurance that all film societies, including non-Victorian film societies, could continue to borrow films from the French and Chinese Embassy Collections (and some Russian titles) under the same terms and conditions as when ACMI managed the NFVLS.

There are 930 films in the collection, 841 are 16mm and 89 are 35mm.

The make-up (based on the catalogue search) is:

"French" 672
"Chinese" 112
"Russian" 11
Other 20

Although oddly, a search by specific language gives a different result!

To check which titles are available:

- 1. Go to the ACMI website http://www.acmi.net.au
- 2. Type in 'other collections' and click 'Search'
- 3. Click on 'other collections'
- 4. Click on 'Search the catalogue of 16mm & 35mm films'
- 5. Search for the terms 'French', 'Chinese' or 'Russian' or search by language.
